Gallery manager Christina Symons is reaching her third anniversary of working for GPAG and has been an incredible addition to the team. Christina, you continue to make us proud.

Our 2024 exhibition year is turning out to be a vibrant lineup and work continues to attract sponsors, who are more important to us than ever before. For this support we are very grateful.

My congratulations to founding members Pat and Murray Drope on winning the Sunshine Coast Arts Council Frances Wasserlein Award for community leadership in the arts this year. We are so proud of you both! GPAG also received the Sunshine Coast People's Choice award for favourite art gallery for the third year in a row!

Of course, I'd like to finish off by acknowledging the huge contribution made by volunteers at all levels of the organization. From board members to our gallery wall painters; from the curatorial committee to our gardener, we could not open our doors without you, and we are ever grateful.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

The Gallery had an exciting and encouraging financial year. The financial highlight was the legacy gift from the estate of Joe Peters in the amount of \$164,000. This has been invested for current and future benefit to GPAG.

We are, once again, most grateful for the wonderful support of our many community sponsors, grants from the Town of Gibsons, the SCRD, District of Sechelt, and the very generous contribution from Sunshine Coast Credit Union.

Our gift shop, under the dedicated care of RoseAnn Janzen, increased sales this year by \$1,000 to \$37,150. The gift shop sales, along with sale of art from our regular gallery shows resulted in payment to local artists of \$45,316.

Despite positive gains in our legacy account, securing ongoing operating funding is a necessary focus as we are still operating at a deficit of approximately \$35,000 per year.

CURATORIAL COMMITTEE

The work of the Curatorial Committee continued this year with an exhibition calendar that featured the first GPAG Sunshine Coast Pride exhibition, our second Black History Month exhibition, and displays of paintings, drawings, photography, sculptures, carvings, textile work, video projections, and mixed media.

Our efforts to promote Indigenous cultures in 2023 included the invitational arrangements for Margaret August's participation in the Pride exhibition, developing a consultant relationship with Squamish Nation member Cory Douglas, and continuing our ongoing project work developing an online cultural guide in collaboration with the Squamish Nation, IM4 Lab, and Digital Museums Canada. One of the related next steps we are working on is identifying how to reach out and connect with the Squamish Nation art community and share best practices for creating local public art opportunities for Squamish Nation artists.

Our recent call for artist members to join the Committee was very successful and we are fortunate to be moving ahead with an expanded team that will bring new skills, experiences and perspectives to assist with future planning. The annual call for submissions this year (for 2024 exhibitions) was the Gallery's largest to date. It took members of the Curatorial Jury an average of two full days each to review all the submissions, in addition to the time for the in-person jury meeting. It looks like we will have another interesting and diverse year of art ahead!

With a strong background in textile arts, she has now embraced expressive palette knife oils and digital painting. Her artwork has been shown in solo shows at Sunshine Coast Art Centre (1992, 2009). She joined the Board in 2018 and her website and social media database skills have helped support the Gallery behind the scenes since 2012.

Stewart Stinson (Past President) has a Master of Arts in (Public Policy and Administration), a Bachelor of Arts (Canadian Studies) and employment experience with Citizenship & Immigration Canada and BC Environment, Lands & Parks. He has been a member of GPAG since 2007, had a solo exhibition of his paintings at the Gallery in 2010, and served as President of the GPAG Board from 2016-2019. He returned to the Board to help with the Curatorial Committee and help define the Gallery's long-term governance and strategic planning.
